BOYSCOUTS OF AMERICA - MUSTER - NEWBURY MA

11-13th June 2010

The weekend of 11-12-13 June, 2010, the Regiment, under command of Lieutenant Colonel O'Shaughnessy, will encamp and participate in a muster to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the Boy Scouts of America. This opportunity to educate our next generation is a vital part of our mission.

Dress for the weekend is natural wigs, haversacks, and water bottles [#1]. Caps or hats to be worn per the orders of each company commander. Weapons equipped with flints and hammer stalls. If encamping, please plan to arrive Friday afternoon or evening. If day-tripping, please plan to arrive by 0800 hrs on Saturday or Sunday.

To assist the kitchen in the purchase of provisions, NCOs please immediately contact your companies and by Wednesday provide Chef Steve with an estimate of numbers for meals on Saturday and Sunday.

Directions: The Spencer-Pierce-Little Farm is located at the end of Littles Lane in Newbury MA. From the Boston area or points south, the recommended route is north on Route 95 to exit 50 for Route 1 (Newburyport Turnpike) north. Continue north on Route 1 for approximately 14 miles. Turn right onto Hanover Street, travel about one mile and turn right onto High Road (Route 1A). Littles Lane and the entrance to the site is 0.2 mile on the left.

From points north, take Route 95 south to exit 57, Route 113 east. Take 113 east through Newburyport (High Street). This becomes 1A south. Watch for the entrance to the site on the left about 0.2 mile after the intersection with Hanover Street.

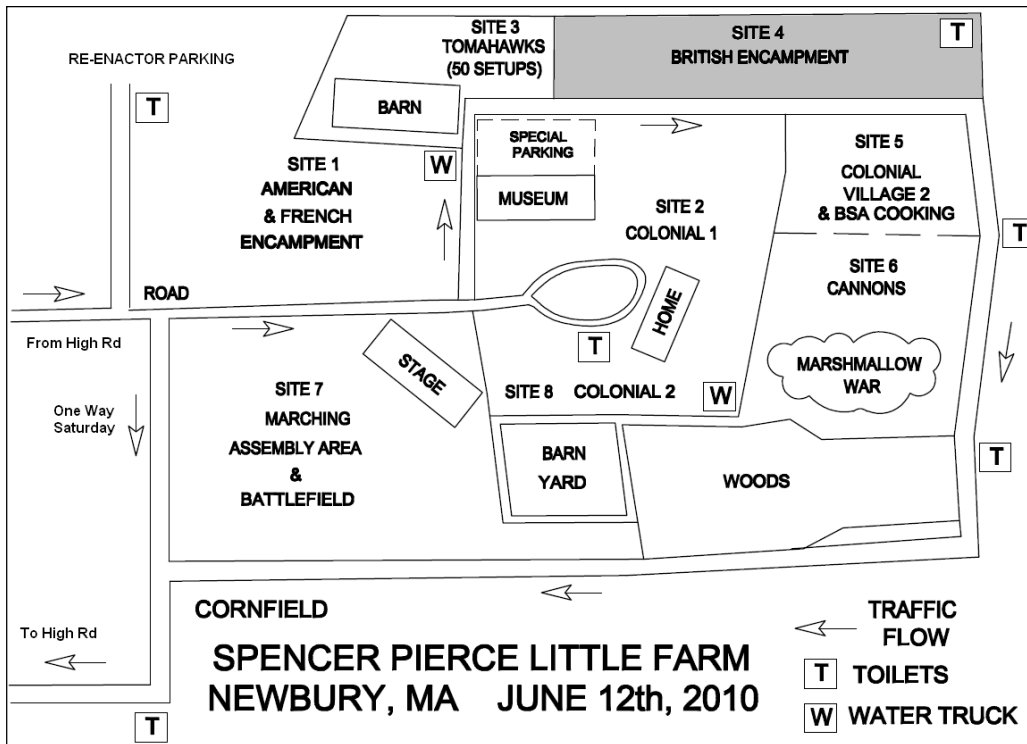

Once on site: Please refer to the included map of the site. Proceed down the long drive towards the historic house and museum. Stop to sign-in near the museum. Turn left into the museum parking lot, drive between the museum and barn, then turn right to the Crown encampment area, which will be laid out in streets. Unload and set up, then as soon as is practical, please drive your vehicle to the re-enactor parking area near the American camp, following the dirt road around the site as shown below. On Friday, it should be possible to turn right and drive directly to the parking area. On Saturday, however, the volume of traffic may require following the exit road back out High Road, then back in the main entrance via Littles Lane.

Event Schedule

Friday 6/11/2010

The site is accessible from 1200 hrs (noon). Early arrival is recommended, as the number of Boy Scouts arriving will increase through the afternoon and early evening. If camping on-site, plan to arrive by 2100 hrs (9 pm) Friday evening. Friday evening dinner will be informal, bring-your-own sausages, dogs, etc.
